2025 Trail Rulebook

The 2025 rulebooks are now available in <u>Shop Pony Club</u> and on the <u>USPC website</u>. Edits and clarifications are noted in red font. Please note the following changes:

- Article 15 Safety: The Safety Committee has made updates to headgear and protective safety vests (policies 0810 and 0830).
- Article 37 Clarification that both stock and side saddles are permitted.
- Article 37 Maximum length of whips is 47.2 inches, including the lash.
- Article 52 Times are not recorded for each obstacle, only the overall time of the In the Open round.
- NEW: Peacock stirrups are no longer permitted.

2026 USPC Festival

The weeklong <u>USPC Festival</u> is held every other year at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Ky., and is a blend of USPC Championships and Educational clinics.

Championships

Pony Club is proud to offer Championship competitions in eight competitive disciplines, as well as open competitions in Gymkhana and Trail. The qualification period for 2026 Festival Championships is January 1, 2025–June 22, 2026 (the entry closing date). Entries will open in spring 2026.

Members who wish to compete at the USPC Festival Championships must meet the age, certification, and competition eligibility requirements as outlined in the rulebooks and in the 2026 Competitor Eligibility Document found on the Championships Information Dage.

Education

USPC Festival Education is open to all USPC members, leaders, and non-members. Mounted clinics are offered in various disciplines, including: Dressage, Show Jumping, Eventing cross-country, distance riding, horsemanship and more. Mounted clinics will be available to audit.

A large variety of unmounted clinics and D Camp are also offered at Festival Education.
