National Office staff updates – Please welcome Addison Gore, who joined the USPC National Office Team originally as the Office Administrator and Charitable Compliance Coordinator. She has been promoted to the Membership Coordinator, as Dawn Strickler will be moving on to explore a new career opportunity. Karen Clark, Finance & Administration Director, retired in September. Staff Account, Bada Faber, has been promoted to Finance & Administration Director. Lizeth Musa, Office Administrator and Charitable Compliance Coordinator, has been promoted to Staff Accountant.

Since the June Board meeting, the National Office staff have concentrated on several key initiatives, which include – completing the data migration project from USEF to Bubble Duck; finalizing the 2026 USPC Festival contract with the Kentucky Horse Park; planning the 2026 USPC Festival Education and Championships under a new structure; communicating year-end club and region requirements to leaders; launching 2026 membership renewals and registration; advancing the year-end Annual Fund campaign; planning with the Lincolnshire Marriott Resort, staff and Local Organizing Committee for the USPC 2026 Convention; directing national testings and certifications; developing new content and courses for Allpony; and collaborating with Burcham Solutions on the strategic plan for the Transformation project.

Report from the Treasurer/Finance Committee

The 2026 Operating Budget was approved.



Report of VP of Instruction

2026 Festival Updates – Two big-name clinicians have been slated – Lendon Gray and Doug Payne. Mounted clinics will be offered in the following disciplines: Eventing Cross Country (starter to Training/Modified), Dressage (Training to 2nd/3rd levels), Show Jumping/Hunter Seat Equitation (2'3" to 3'3"), Mounted Games, ground training/horsemanship, Trail, Polocrosse, and schooling rounds for jumping and riding a Dressage test. D camp will also be offered for 6–12-year-old, D-2 and below members.

For 2026, for local and regional rallies, the required first aid kits will allow one per team per club or center, up to three teams, provided the organizers within the region can stable teams near one another. Otherwise, each team should have its own kits.

Examiners Committee update – The committee continues to develop examiner-related continuing education opportunities for examiners of all levels. There are currently four Apprentice National Examiners.

National Testing Curricula Committee update – The committee has been gathering information and reviewing resources shared by the Horse Welfare Task Force, and is developing a plan to create education on horse welfare (well-being) for all levels.

Regional Instruction Committee (RIC) update – The committee hosted a Zoom meeting in July, where participants were allowed to ask questions and share what is going well in the regions and where help is needed. In addition, the committee is working on a presentation for the USPC 2026 Convention.

National Youth Congress (NYC) and Academy of Achievement Committee update – Two alumni have agreed to be Academy of Achievement honorees: Carleigh Fedorka has agreed to participate, and she is a professor at Colorado State University. Jennifer Verharen, with strong interpersonal skills and founder of Cadence Coaching. The committee is undertaking various outreach activities to educate members and others about the value of the National Youth Congress.

Horse Management (HM) Committee updates – The committee's goal has been to create a Chief Horse Management Handbook. Lena McClelland from the Rocky Mountain Region is a new Chief Horse Management Judge, and Isabella Marini from the Lake Shore Region is a new Provisional Chief Horse Management Judge.

D-1-C-2 Curricula Committee updates – The committee has completed the "Standards Vertical Alignment". This idea is a worksheet that takes one standard topic for each level (D-1 through H-A) with questions or activities for that topic. The committee will present these documents and concepts at the USPC 2026 Convention 2026.

Report of VP of Activities

USPC 2026 Festival

The USPC 2026 Festival will be at the Kentucky Horse Park, July 13-19. There will be a change to the traditional format, due to Kentucky Horse Park removing one day from our schedule, the education portion will

take place first, with the USPC Championships following. As a result, this will alleviate move-in traffic and the need to move from one stall to another in the middle of the week.

Upper-Level Member Showcase

The Upper-Level Member Showcase will be moving from the USPC Championships to the highly visible and very prestigious Defender Kentucky Three-Day Event.

USPC High Point Program

The new USPC High Point Program will debut this fall for competitions beginning in 2026. Shows accredited by recognized national associations may apply for high-point awards to give to USPC members at their events.

USPC Convention

The 2026 USPC Convention will be held at the Lincolnshire Marriott Resort in Lincolnshire, IL, January 28 - February 1, 2026.

The 2027 USPC Convention will be held at the Madison Marriott West in Middletown, WI, January 27-31.
